Power Report

Hello SLYC Sailors,
First off, I will share my Chase Boat news. Since my last article, I've been to Lopez Lake a few more times troubleshooting the Chase Boat engine with lots of help from **Barry Stewart**.

On February 25th, Barry and I went out to Lopez Lake after he had changed out the fuel injectors/basket filters, internal fuel filter, external fuel filter and fuel lines. \Of course it tested OK at home, but we needed to test in under load (on the water). So, off to the lake we went with a few tools, extra parts and fingers crossed for luck. Well, wouldn't you know it, we experienced poor engine performance again with the engine bogging down at around 3100 RPM. At first it was disappointing, but the story continues.

Well Barry suspected that the fuel pressure regulator (which was had a lot of surface corrosion) might not be functioning so he did some testing while we were on the lake. This little valve keeps the correct amount of fuel in the fuel rail that supplies the fuel injectors and works off of a vacuum tube to open/close. We worked the internal spring with some carb cleaner about 15 plus times and each time the engine ran better for a while. Great news! In my mind we found the bad part causing the engine to run poorly at higher speeds/RPM. At one point during our testing, we are able to get the engine to full throttle and up to 6100 RPM!

This fuel pressure regulator was fairly expensive from Yamaha at about \$250 from the cheapest supplier, but Barry was able to find a better deal on eBay and purchased it. So after the March Lopez Race, he changed regulator even with a stubborn corroded screw holding it tight. Then on March 11th, we headed back to the Lake for another test. The engine didn't run 100 percent as we both had hoped it would right off the bat. But after working the engine throttle numerous times and running around the lake for some time, the engine started working better. We figured that the valve might have been sitting on the shelf for some time and was working itself out. At the end, we were consistently running the engine

around 5500 RPM and up to about 26 Knots/30 MPH. So, it appears that the Chase Boat is running well! We should be all set for the 3rd Lopez Lake Race in April.

Thanks Barry for troubleshooting the Chase Boat outboard engine and also being the Chase Boat Captain for the March Lopez Lake Race! A big thanks also goes out to his crew **Peggy Golden** and friend **Greg!** Please check out the many great photos **Michael Dobrzensky** took that day on the SLYC's website under Photos, Racing, Lake and Ocean Races and March 4. Looks like it was a great day on the water.

If you have an interest participating in the excitement of our SLYC racing activities as a Chase


Boat crewmember, please sign up on our website's Volunteer Sign Up Sheet. For qualified Captains, we have open dates available. Please contact me if you have any questions.

From the Treasurer

Ahoy SLYC Members. Although 2017 ended with \$12,962 of expenses in excess of income, we're still in fine financial shape, as our cash balances remain well in excess of our estimated required capital reserves.

Each year the Board prepares a forecast of the amount and expected timing of major expenses for replacement of furniture, fixtures and equipment (FF&E). The purpose of this analysis is to estimate the amount of liquid assets that should be kept on hand to ensure that adequate funds will be available in the future when specific items of FF&E will need to be replaced. Based on that analysis, we estimate that the Club should be maintaining a reserve of approximately \$206,000 of cash or other liquid investments for future FF&E replacements. And as of December 31, 2017, the Club had

\$273,849 in its bank accounts, so we are adequately reserved now and expect to remain so throughout 2018.

For the year 2017, income received by the Club totaled \$103,588, which breaks down as shown in the accompanying pie chart (top chart below).

As is typical for the Club, approximately half of our operating funds come from member dues and about another 20%-25% from bar sales, although bar sales have declined somewhat over the past two years.


The second pie chart (bottom chart below) displays expenses, which totaled \$116,550 for the year.

Expenses for operating the clubhouse (cleaning, utilities, maintenance and repairs) have been higher than usual for the past two years due to the renovation of both restrooms. Boating expenses were also unusually high in 2017, primarily due to necessary chase boat repairs—mainly for the outboard motor.



Archie McLaren 1942-2018

Long-time Yacht Club member Archie McLaren passed away peacefully in his Avila Beach home on February 20, 2018. His memorial service will be held at the Avila Beach Golf Course on Sunday April 22 from 1-5pm. He had been a member of the San Luis Yacht Club for so long that no records exist to affirm the exact year he joined. He had not been around the Clubhouse much in recent years because he had moved to Santa Barbara but returned to his Avila home in October 2017.



He was famous for creating and directing the Central Coast Wine Classic. Two articles were written about him and his life's work in the San Luis Obispo Tribune as follows:



On Sunday March 11th, our Boatmaster Dan Pease, SLYC/ Cuesta College sailing instructor Eion Duffy, myself, plus SLYC sailors Marty Fuller and Thomas Hill took advantage of a gap in the wet weather to prep and paint "Slo Sloops" running surface with antifouling bottom paint. Our Club Catalina 22 sport was in need of a few things that were best completed before springtime.

We rolled two coats on the hull, rudder and as much of her swing keel as we could access on the trailer.

Between coats, we had refreshments and "watched paint dry" — time flies with a cold drink and a snack. The hull sides above that were waxed, the railings were polished, the standing rigging was measured for replacement and she was raised up temporarily on jacks and wood blocks to paint above the trailer support bunks.

We are presently awaiting a synchronized "window" of adequate tide, fair weather and water taxi schedule to re-launch her and commence sailing, racing and training new sailors.
