You should have gotten a postcard with the 2019 cruising schedule in your mail by now, so take a few minutes to read it, and call our Cruising Captain **Lettie Fuller** if you need more information on any event.

On the local front, the Friends of Avila Pier Committee will be formulating fund raising strategies for fully opening Avila pier. The barrier is expected to be moved out to "Bent" (row) #59 very soon. The Harbor Commission received a favorable load study report from the consulting engineer that delineates a much shorter and less expensive path to complete opening, and ongoing maintenance. We expect SLYC and its members to be involved with this process, that will restore water access in Avila.

Ocean sport fishing will get a boost in April when local waters re-open to more of our resident species.

We are working on renewing the Small Boat Program, with small beach launched boats stored under the clubhouse, but it is not finalized as of writing. We should have the repaired mainsail back on "Slo Sloop" before you read this, and sailing lessons and boat checkouts should have resumed. So far she has weathered the storms to date, and **Bill Dyer** and Vice Commodore Jim Gilletly have been tending to her needs. Thanks to Marty Fuller for taking care of the mainsail last month. Port Captain Ken San Fillipo is also exploring expanded Water Taxi hours to the mooring area on Wednesday, race days and special events.

Or Rear Commodore **Mike Davis** has been taking care of our clubhouse and its systems regularly, and the keycard reader and the internet service have been much improved. The security cameras are going to be upgraded soon but they will mainly cover the existing areas. Our fireplace chimney was replaced by **Steve Dahl** and **Marty Fuller** between rainstorms so the "cozy corner" is back to normal.

On 2/19, sailor and SLYC Member **Kevin Williams** presented an informal talk on a couple nautical subjects, such as racing strategies, and sailing around Pt. Conception. We hope to hold another Yactsmans talk on Tuesday 3/19, we are attempting to have more practical nautical education opportunities for members and guests covering wide variety of subjects

that don't come in a basic boating course.

I will close by the usual, "See you on the water and at the

Club" and once again asking you to sign up for club duties if you haven't already.


