

St. Martin/St.Maarten Adventure



St. Martin/St. Maarten Adventure

In January, some SLYC members encountered excellent sailing and weather conditions on the French/Dutch island of St. Martin. **Tom McNeill** captained the 46 foot brand new CATANA catamaran chartered from Dream Yacht Charters in Marina de L'Anse Marcel. Tom and his wife, **Janine**, were accompanied by life-

long friends, **Brian** and **Kathy Metcalf**. There were four ocean loving couples on the four berth luxury yacht.

The day of arrival, Janine and Kathy spent the day shopping in Grand Case for boat provisions. They filled three full grocery carts to ensure there was enough food for the week at sea. There were a few confusions in the French to English translations (like buying cuttlefish instead of cod) but, as it turned out, the crew had fabulous conditions for cooking and eating gourmet meals onboard. There was a fabulous cajun restaurant in Grand Case where the crew gathered for a first dinner and then spent the night at a quaint hotel.

Dream Yacht charters did a great job of familiarizing the crew with the ins and outs of the catamaran. All provisions and belongings were loaded and we enjoyed our first night on the boat in the Anse Marcel Harbor.

The first sail was to Sandy Ground Bay on Anguilla Island. The crew fell into their natural roles whether it was galley chef, anchor boy, bartender, sail tender, map planner... without too much direction from the captain. The staterooms and lounging zones were fabulously comfortable.

From Sandy Ground Bay, the crew sailed to Prickly Pear Island. A thrilling boat ride in the dinghy through a wave set took them to a deserted island set up with lounge chairs and interesting flora and fauna to explore. Later in the day another amazing sail to Crocus Bay where a game night onboard made for a lot of laughter.

Scrub Island was the next sailing destination the following morning. A wild landing in our dinghy on Scrub Island provided another small boat thrill. An afternoon sail down to Tintamarre



Island was where they picked up a mooring for the night. Tintamarre is a natural preserve with turquoise waters.

A sail to Orient Bay to anchor anew, provided lots of entertainment like watching kite surfers and a variety of interesting yachts (like the Adam and Eve yacht piloted by a naked crew).

The last sailing day was around the circumference of St. Martin

landing in Grand Case Bay. A dinghy ride took them into town where the cajun restaurant was revisited for a last night's meal.

All in all it was a dream boat with a dream crew in the best of conditions for sailing!



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
