
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Vice Views



The staff at the port are trying to keep the cost of dredging down by applying for a reclassification of the dredged and heading for Spanish Town, Virgin Gorda then points beyond. Thanks to our Captains **Pat Mullen**, **Bob Hurd**, **JJ Francoisse**, **Marty Fuller**, **Jack Luxton**, and **Grant Elwood** we have 43 members and friends participating in the trip.

I can tell you from experience, if you like to boat, sail, and spend time in and around water these trips are some of the best times you can have. Sometimes there are the challenges of travel, weather, provisioning or ?, but somehow any challenges we have are better together.

We will return just after the first of April with stories to be sure.

material, from "disposable material" to "fill material." This may take some time with the permitting procedures but would save the port considerable amounts of money each year. They are looking to start dredging on March 12 and may extend the season due to the delay caused by permitting issues.

The piers were also discussed in great detail. The commissioners maintained that the Harford Pier is their top priority which, due to maintenance needed because of storm damage and the dredge, may further delay progress on the Avila Pier. They are aiming to open the Avila Pier to bent 70 by October, meaning that the public could access a portion of the pier. Once they reach this point, they will need speciality equipment to continue the project. They are exploring options to contract out the remainder of the project but may face budget challenges once they reach bent 70.


